

President's Letter

Last year was a great year in Wood Glen. We solved problems and mended fences... literally. The stone fence along FM 3406 has had major repair work and should be in good shape for several years. Our wood fences throughout the neighborhood have been repaired and painted and ready for a couple more years before we must replace them. (If your property has association fence in need of repair, please contact your section representative or me.)

In 2009 we will continue working to replace message centers that are literally falling apart. The process is now at the contract negotiation stage. I know that you will be pleased because the new message centers will be part of covered mail centers throughout the neighborhood. When this project is completed, there will be increased parking at the amenity center and off street parking for all of the mail pods at that location.

We did have some incidences of crime in 2008 and I solicit all of you as good neighbors to be on the lookout for suspicious actions, to know what the city ordinances require of you regarding curfews, parking, noise and any others that help us to be good neighbors. Richard Johnson is the lieutenant assigned to this section of Round Rock. He oversees all police services and holds responsibility for all criminal activity investigation and quality of life issues. I will be meeting with him occasionally to discuss issues specific to Wood Glen. Please let me know if you have concerns.

In order to continue to protect our property values in these very interesting financial times, the board members will be working together with the management company to enforce our deed restrictions. One of the most elusive of deed restrictions addresses how we use our garages. Garages are to be used to park cars in, not for storage for more

than 30 days at a time. If you have questions, please contact me or another board member and we will try to provide clarification. The bylaws state that not only board members, but all members of the association in general are responsible to uphold the covenants. In other words, each of us agreed to abide by these restrictions to keep our neighborhood desirable and marketable. Indian Meal Moths

There are numerous insects that infest stored products; typically they are brought into the home by infested products. Food can become infested while in the field, warehouses or stores.

Indian meal moths can be found in dogfood, birdseed, cereals, dried fruit, nuts, powdered milk and candy. Adults are small with grayish wings tipped with copper. Larvae are creamy yellow and often crawl along pantry walls. Spun pupal cases are often found along corners and edges of wall areas.

To eliminate a pantry pest problem, the first step is to locate and remove all infested items. Removing infested items is the easy part; finding the infestation is not always so simple. Begin with

the oldest food items, usually in the back of the pantry. Inspect everything, including unopened food items since these can also be a source. If you find an infested item, do not stop your inspection, more than one item may be infested.



Infested items can be thrown away. If you don't feel that you can throw away food, place the infested food in a ziptop plastic bag and place it in the freezer for about 5-7 days or spread the infested food item on a baking sheet and bake at 250 degrees for 4-6 hours to kill any insects. Once all the insects are dead, you can sift the food item or pick out the insects. Of course, you can always just leave the insects in the food and get a little

more protein with your meal!

It is extremely important to find the source, and not all pantry pest infestations come from the pantry. Check rooms for items such as dried, decorative peppers, dried flowers, potpourri or rice heating packs.
