

A Word From The President...

As we move to the spring and summer season we will all move outside to enjoy the weather and outdoor activities. Please use the Wood Glen web site website (www.woodglen.org) to answer any questions that you might have concerning the procedures at our community facilities. The Wood Glen Amenity Center and pool is for use by its members and their guests only. We have rules and regulations to assure safe and sanitary operation. These rules and regulations listed on our web site are not all-inclusive or legally precise and no liability is assumed for completeness. The facilities in Wood Glen are for members and guests. Everyone uses any Wood Glen facility at his or her own risk. Reminder, call 911 in case of EMERGENCY. I ask that all members please comply with the rules as posted at the Amenity Center and on our website. Below is a short summary of some of the high points for safe and fun operation of the Wood Glen facilities.

Amenity Center: The Amenity Center becomes the center of community activity during these months. Please remember, parents that there is no authority figure at the Center or other community facilities. Any use of the Amenity Center must be coordinated through the Goodwin Management Company. We do not permit the facilities to be used for private parties. Members are responsible for the actions of their family and guests. While our guests are welcome, non-members are not and are not allowed to use the facilities we pay for with our dues. The Center and Pool require a key for access and please remember that duplication of keys is prohibited. We all have the right to ask persons at the pool to show their key. Two other requests: please help us keep the area clean and also remember during inclement weather, such as thunder, lightning, or tornado, it is best to clear the Amenities Center and seek secure shelter.

Parking: The Parking area is small and often congested. We also have many smaller children in that area, please drive slowly and carefully within the parking areas. Please use only the designated areas, do not obstruct other cars, or the main entrance to the pool/tennis court. To help with control and supervision, parking hours are from 6:00am to 10:00pm, unless otherwise noted. There is no overnight parking.

Pool: Of all the areas, the pool represents the area of greatest fun, refreshment, and danger. THERE IS NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY, all members and guests "swim at their own risk". In case of EMERGENCY - Call 911. As stated above, the pool is for the use of members who are current in their dues. Guests are limited to four (4) per family. Members are responsible for informing their guests of the rules. For the pool season, the operating hours are 6:00am to 10:00pm Monday through Sunday (unless otherwise noted). The pool season will be from April 1 to November 30. Anyone in the facility after operating hours will be considered to be trespassing.

Parents are responsible in determining the skill level of their children and guests before allowing them to swim at the pool without adult supervision. Children under the age of 14 must be accompanied and supervised by an adult (18 years or older) at all times. The gate to the pool area must be closed and latched at all times. Please do not prop the gate open.

The baby pool is primarily for children six (6) and under. Older children can use the pool only if it does not have a negative impact on the smaller children. Adults are responsible for, and shall not leave unattended, the children in their care in the baby pool. Each child must be accompanied at all times by an adult, who will be solely responsible for the child's safety. All Infants and toddlers must have appropriate swimwear. Proper swimming diapers with tight plastic pants are required for all non-toilet trained infants. Disposable diapers are not allowed within the pool. Usage of floating devices is permitted with supervision.

Please do not use the pool or permit a child or guest to do so, while suffering from any contagious disease, such as athlete's foot, ringworm, colds, flu, etc. or while suffering from an open wound or sore. Also remind the kids that spitting, spouting of water, blowing of nose, etc., are strictly prohibited in the pool area. Also, please no glass, weapons or sharp items in the pool area. Motorized vehicles are strictly prohibited within the fenced pool area. A bike rack is available outside the gated area for securing all bikes, mopeds, etc.

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Contamination is a big concern for all of us. If the pool has been contaminated call the Management Company immediately at 512-502-7509 (Goodwin Management). The pool will have to be closed for treatment and will remain closed until water tests indicate it is safe to re-open. Signs will be posted to indicated openings or closings of the pool.

Tennis Court: The Wood Glen Amenity Center tennis courts are also restricted to Wood Glen Property Owner Association Members with accompanied family and guests. Members are responsible for informing their guests of the rules. The tennis court times are from 6:00am to 10:00pm. The gate to the Tennis court must be closed and latched after entering or leaving the court at all times. No running shoes are allowed on the court, tennis shoes only. The tennis court surface can be damage by incorrect foot apparel. No pets, bicycles, tricycles, skateboards, roller skates, or roller blades are allowed inside the fenced area. The use of radios, tape or CD players, and/or musical instruments is limited to headphones only, played at a volume that does not disturb others. The use of the tennis court shall be limited to one hour for singles play and one and one half hours for doubles play if others are present and waiting to use the court. No more than four players in the court are permitted.

Basketball Court: The basketball court is for Wood Glen residents and their guests only. Basketball play is permitted during the hours of 6:00 am and 10:00 pm. All other uses are prohibited including skateboarding, rollerblading and bking. No glass containers, alcoholic beverages, tobacco products or pets are permitted. No littering. Please use the trash recepticles by the tennis court and playscape. Do not dunk basketball or hang on the rim. Residents shall be responsible for paying for repairs and clean-up expenses caused by family members and guests. Please be considerate of your neighbors by playing on half the court if others are waiting and limit play time to one hour. Anyone causing a disturbance will be required to leave. Disturbances include, but are not limited to, fighting, foul language, inappropriate music and music volume.

Playscape: The playscape area is a very important facility in this community. Please no glass, weapons or sharp items in and around the Playscape. Parents please check to ensure that there are no scarves or other loose clothing is permitted while on the Playscape. These items have been known to cause physical injury and sometimes death. Additionally, please no backpacks to be worn during play. Parents please instruct your children to share turns on all of the play equipment. There should be no running around the playscape. It is best to leave the gravel on the ground. For safety sake please ask the children to use the equipment the way it was intended (i.e. going down on the slide), and no jumping from the top of the playscape.

Hike and Bike Trail: The hike and bike trail is an area that we have great pride. We spend a lot of money to maintain and improve this facility. Please remind users that there is no king of the road on the multi-use trails. EVERYONE must follow the trail rules and use courtesy and common sense to avoid accidents. Please obey trail signs; be courteous to others and do not block the trail! We all have the responsibility for picking up any trash, as it is our community. All pets/animals must be kept on a short leash and under control at all times. The best place is on the right shoulder of the trail, next to their owner. Don't let your pet leave anything behind on the trail. Private motorized vehicles (except wheelchairs) are not permitted on the trails. Cyclists must yield to foot traffic. There is private property around the trail, respect private property. Don't trespass! Pedestrians have the right-of-way on trails and sidewalks. However, groups of pedestrians should form a single-file to allow bicyclists and others to pass. When crossing at Plantation, remember that trail users do not have the right of way.

There is other more specific rules that I ask that each of you review with your family before using the pool. With your help it will be a great pool season. As stated, all members must comply with the posted rules. The Wood Glen Property Owners Association, its personnel, or Managing Agent has the right to evict anyone from the pool area not in compliance with these rules. Additionally, the Association or Managing Agent may take action to impose fines or to suspend the use of the pool for violation of these rules. A Reminder About Our Furry Friends

Any allowable pet must be confined to the owners lot by fence, leash or confined in the home. No animal is permitted to run freely. This includes cats! The Need For Speed!

Maybe it's just me, but sometimes I think that traffic actually travels faster in our neighborhood than on I-35.

I blame some of it on the TV. "Top Gun" has been playing lately and I picture drivers, caught up in the frenzy screaming "I feel the need for speed!" as they round the turn from 3406 to Plantation, expertly dodging the potholes then quickly accelerating as they barrel down the street at freeway speeds cutting precious seconds off of their commute times.

Obviously, the best solution is to call the Police Department. Round Rock's finest love our neighborhood and are very prompt regarding complaints. The Police are more than willing to show both visitors and residents alike that traffic signs do actually apply to them, even if they do live here.

Slowing down will not significantly increase your drive time and might even save the life of a resident or pet (or at least save you from a ticket).
